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### **Diagnostic Test Results Are Documented**

As a general rule, diagnostic tests performed as baseline documentation of a healthy eye, or as preventive medicine to screen for potential disease, are not covered by most medical insurance plans, including Medicare.

Results from these achievement tests are acceptable as measures of skills in a timed setting and should be used to document the need for extended time. They are not sufficient documentation when used alone and should be supplemental to

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other achievement tests.

Documentation guideline: The results of discussion of laboratory, radiology or other diagnostic tests with the physician who performed or interpreted the study should be documented.

Documentation guideline: The direct visualization and independent interpretation of an image, tracing or specimen previously or subsequently interpreted by another physician should be documented.

Documentation Guidelines for Medicare Services Incomplete or illegible records can result in denial of payment for services billed to Medicare. In order for a claim for Medicare benefits to be valid, there must be sufficient documentation in the provider's or hospital's records to verify the services performed were "reasonable and necessary ...

## **Documentation Guidelines for Medicare Services - Noridian**

When a provider reports DMEPOS items on a claim, 1. Diagnosis establishing medical necessity for the item, 2. Clinical notes that justify the DMEPOS item ordered, 3. Provider order for DMEPOS item, signed and dated, and 4. Signed advance beneficiary notice if medical necessity for an item cannot be established.
